Have you ever wanted to help Veterans who have given so much to our country? Do you love dogs? Do you want to help train a pup that will be given to a disabled Veteran at no cost to him or her? (Most Veterans wait for years before a dog becomes available.) You truly may be helping save a life of a Veteran! It is a well publicized fact that 22 Vets, on average, take their lives every day.

Where do I begin? I think I will start with the wiggly pups. They have big eyes, puppy breath, and shaky feet and legs. When they look up at you, you melt. They shower you with love. That is just the beginning of an awesome journey for the next 12-18 months, where you, as a puppy raiser, stand to receive unconditional love from the puppy! Each puppy literally works for your love!

Being a puppy raiser (PR) for a service dog-in-training is the best "job" I have ever had. Once the pups are weaned, they are ready for a PR home and simple training. We have just welcomed a new litter of 7 that will be ready to start training in mid-July 2020. I have, until recently, been the PR for a brother in the first litter, Gunter, a German Shepherd who has now become a service dog for a disabled Veteran. I have also been the PR for clients who had a profound physical handicap. Service dogs do a variety of services ... but the basic training for the first months is essentially the same as for any new pup.

Starting with house training; sit, come and down; the commands are simple and relatively easy for the pup to learn. Once the puppy reaches success on the early tasks; you will be trained to teach other commands. Seriously, we do not train a dog we train you, the handler. In all, you and your puppy will successfully master 30+ commands. Don't worry if you don't think you know how to do this? I plan to give weekly or bi-weekly lessons to all of our puppy trainers. You will have support from the very first, including written instructions for each step.

I am often asked how hard it is to give the dog up, after puppy training, for advanced training. It is not easy; but knowing the mission they are being trained to give, that being love and support to the Veterans, it makes the transition easier.

Service Dog training with Warrior Patriot Pups

Welcome 7 new German Shepherd Pups To add to the 9 pups (now 9 mos. old) that have been given, at no cost, to 9 retired military service Veterans.

We already have several Vets lined up take on the responsibility of these exemplary future service dogs, including one gentleman of Apache heritage, who has himself stepped up to help us with volunteer training.

Historically:

In about 2007, a founding effort began to honor the life and service of Veterans.

A life-long friend, Captain William A Griffis, USMC, was killed in Vietnam in 1968, when the helicopter he was riding in was blown up while transporting he and his troops out of a Viet Nam marine's camp in a very dangerous Vietnam war zone. Captain Griffis' s duties at that time was serving the Vietnam Marines as an advisor. Captain Griffis grew up in San Angelo, West Texas, attended Sewanee, University of the South, and

graduated from the US Naval Academy. Following graduation Captain Griffis served as aide to his General, before being appointed to the elite responsibility as advisor to the Vietnam Marines.

A highly honored Green Beret, SFC Riley Stephens, Ranger, a native of Tolar, Texas and a voluntary fireman with the Tolar Volunteer Fire Department was killed in the Afghanistan / Iraq wars.

The first effort at honoring these and other warriors was the acquisition of 253 military heavy combat tactical trucks, the setting up of a Military like Depot, adjacent to Camp Shelby, near Hattiesburg, MS where the 94 Dump Trucks, 73 Wreckers, and various troop carriers and auxiliary equipment were brought in, lined up, as in military motor pool protocol; and from there former Army, Marine, Navy and other Veterans were invited in and paid to work on the exact pieces of equipment they became familiar with during their military service. The idea was to give these Vets the opportunity to come together, to reacclimate them to what they knew, but in a civilian workplace, and with the military equipment they had experience with. After three years, the repairable trucks were completed, repainted and disposed of.

Later, a lodge facility was acquired, where once developed, more disabled veterans were to be invited to come work with pieces of heavy equipment, with the idea that they learn their type of Caterpillar, Case, etc. equipment, for the purposes of them becoming entrepreneur owners of their own fleet of equipment, and where jobs for construction, utility and other companies could be negotiated for them.

All this was done in preparation for the acquisition of a Texas property, where with the opening of a Training Academy, the equipment training would continue. Additionally, projects like the German Shepherd Dog training center would be developed where German Shepherd dogs would be bred and trained for disabled Vets. We are looking for that site now, where in addition to the above, we will continue the teaching and training of entrepreneurs with heavy equipment, teaching them to own and manage their own businesses in right of way management, excavation, building and other business ownerships.

On one property we are researching, there are areas where a small business park can be developed, and individual housing can be built for disabled veterans.

An area of the property will be developed where the new Main Tolar Fire Station will be built to serve and protect the largest, fastest growing area of Hood County (8th fastest growing county in the nation).
